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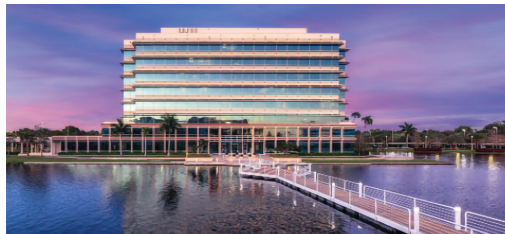

EHDOC Development Update:

What is **DE-VEL-OP-MENT?**

Development (*noun*) is defined as the process of growth. EHDOC's development focus is twofold: preserving our existing housing communities and expanding the availability of housing inventory for aging seniors.



Today's older adults and those nearing retirement age are significantly more vulnerable than earlier generations as to the likelihood of finding affordable housing options. Most seniors own their homes, but the percentage of older adults who rent is expected to increase to 23 percent by 2035. The United States has a shortage of more than 7.2 million affordable rental homes for extremely low-income renter households. The supply of quality affordable housing for low-income older adults is declining while demand is increasing, threatening the ability of our vulnerable seniors to successfully age in-place in their communities. Gentrification has increased housing costs, leaving millions of older adults with limited affordable housing options, especially in housing communities offering supportive services. Federally subsidized housing programs for seniors with low incomes have been chronically underfunded and eliminated at a time when regions have seen an increased focus on delivering non-institutional and lower cost home and community-based services to older adults.

For seniors living on fixed incomes and with little savings, affordable housing is especially critical. Low-income older adults need access to a network of affordable housing, health care, long-term care and social supports to age in their communities. EHDOC provides quality, safe and secure affordable housing enriched with services, and we **are** making an impact in the housing gap. But we need to do more! Low-income older adults who are severely cost-burdened spend 62 percent less on health care, forgoing healthy food or delaying medications to afford monthly rent payments. This decision – to choose between food, medications, and rent - may impact their overall health outcomes.

As we move into Quarter 2, 2022, our continued efforts to preserve our properties, expand opportunities and provide the utmost in quality management, maintenance, services, and customer service, are all attributed to the unsurpassed dedication and commitment of each EHDOC employee. When 'team effort' is applied, we can and will make a difference!

For those properties currently in the preservation and development pipeline, progress has been good and remains steady.....

STEVE PROTULIS TOWERS EAST AND WEST, MIAMI, FL

As April ended, EHDOC achieved 100% occupancy at Steve Protulis Towers East and West, officially launching this beautiful newly constructed, two-building 119-unit property into the history book of yet another EHDOC success story. A big round of applause to everyone involved!



NORTH PARK VILLAGE, CHICAGO, IL

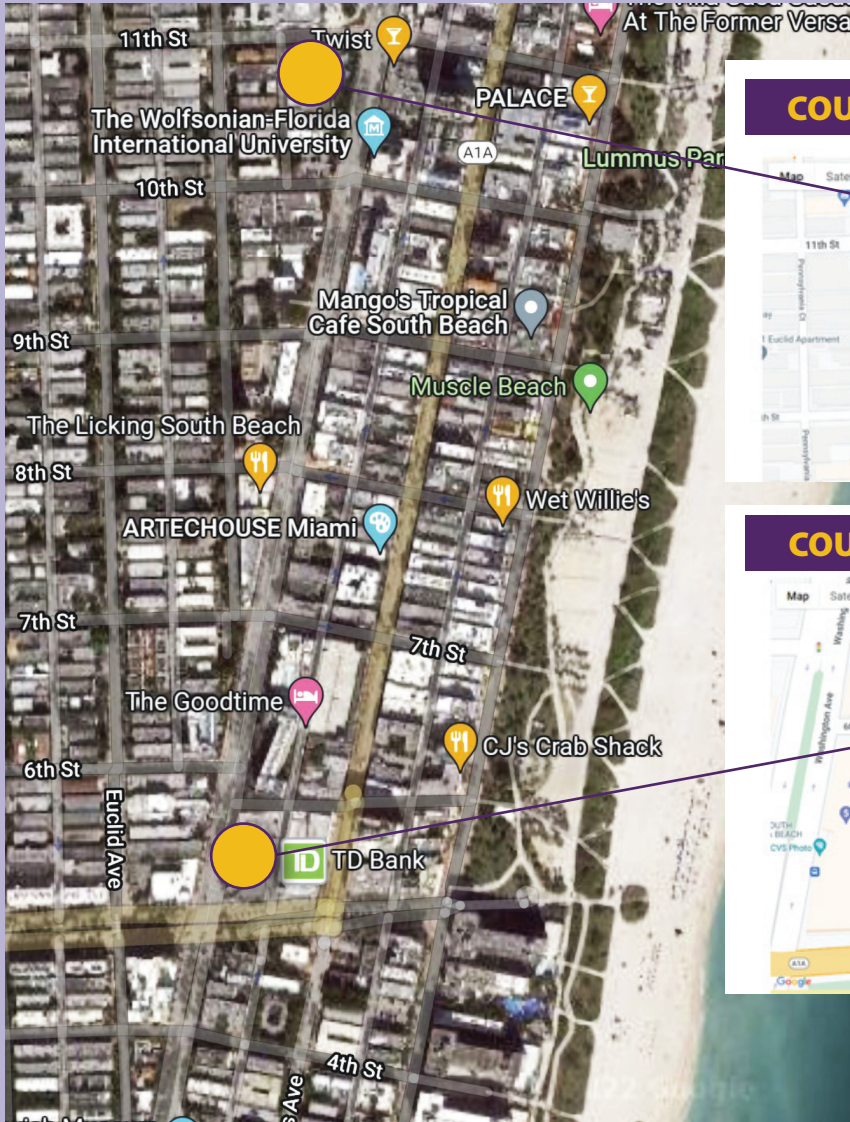
As of April 2022, renovation of this 180-unit historic property reached 46% complete. Phase I renovation, which consisted of 52 units in buildings 1000 and 3000, is now finished, and the units are re-occupied by seniors qualifying under the low-income housing tax credit program.

Phase II renovation, consisting of building 2000 with 48 units, is underway and is expected to be completed in September 2022. Phase III, consisting of building 4000 with 80 units and the community building, is expected to commence in October with a goal to reach substantial completion by early Quarter 2, 2023.



MOSAICO, MIAMI, FL

The 271-unit new construction property called Mosaico located in the heart of the Allapattah neighborhood of Miami is about to begin lease-up with a certificate of occupancy expected to be issued in June 2022. Given the high demand for quality affordable housing in South Florida, Mosaico is expected to reach 100% occupancy in just a short few months, and once occupied, it will serve as a beacon of hope for many deserving seniors!



COUNCIL TOWERS NORTH AND SOUTH, MIAMI BEACH, FL

The renovation of one of EHDOD's flagship properties, Council Towers North and South, is well underway with the fruit of our labor beginning to shine through as we reach 20% complete with an expected completion date of June 2023. Some say we are crazy to take on the challenges of renovating two, 12-story buildings five blocks apart with 250 total units in a condensed Miami Beach community. EHDOD's response: **"Bring it on"** if it preserves an asset and improves the quality of life for seniors!

Looking ahead....

As we look ahead to our 2022-23 goals, we are carefully examining our portfolio to create an achievable pipeline of properties for preservation while keeping our eyes and ears open for new construction and acquisition opportunities. Our concentrated efforts will ensure that these goals are attainable while contributing to the growing challenge of the affordability housing crisis.

- How well you can remember

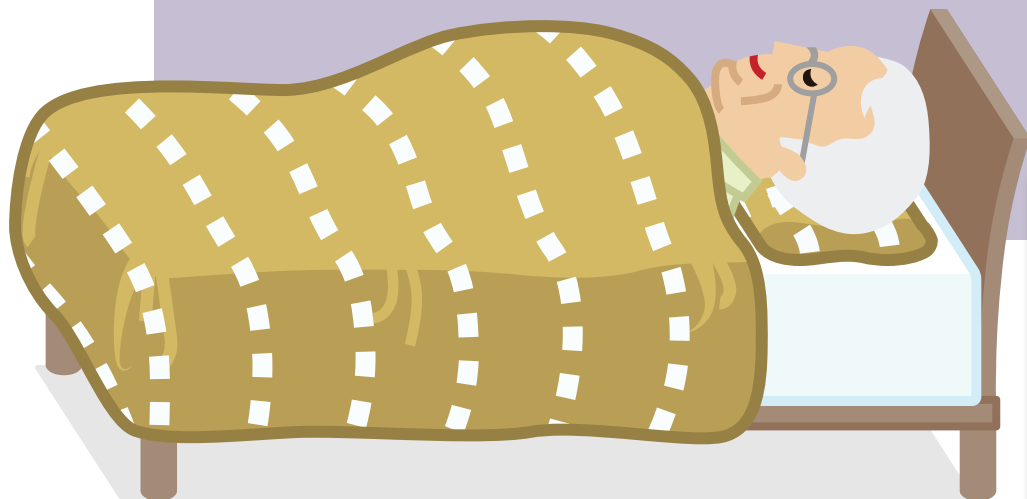
True or False:
