EHDOC: New Horizons... Growth at its best!

Even during a global pandemic under new leadership, EHDOC has continued to forge full speed ahead to preserve and expand quality affordable housing for senior citizens and the disabled seniors across the country. Over the past year, EHDOC has worked tirelessly to strategically plan and achieve success in several multifamily housing ventures, all of which we are so proud to display.



North Park Village Apartments is a 180-unit historic-designated community located within EHDOC's North Park Village Campus in Chicago. The community officially became a permanent member of the EHDOC portfolio family with a successful acquisition in February 2021 after a two-year effort to pull together layers of financing and to create a comprehensive scope of work that when finished, will improve the quality of living for seniors. The three phased planned renovation began in March 2021 and continues to move forward even with several unforeseen challenges. At present, the project is approximately 38% renovated with a target completion date of June 2023.

Dino Papavero Senior Centre is a 150-unit high-rise community in Fontana California, just west of Los Angeles in San Bernardino County. This 'tenant in-place' preservation began in August 2019 and successfully reached its 100% completion in June 2021. The renovation included new kitchen cabinets, new bathrooms, new flooring, new lighting and fixtures, new VRF central HVAC system, a fresh coat of paint in and out, numerous other upgrades to common areas, and amenities that included modernizing two elevators.



Council Towers North & South, EHDOC's two flagship properties located in Miami Beach, are walking distance to the famous turquoise waters of the Atlantic Ocean and warm sands of South Beach. The two properties consist of 250 units and are undergoing a tenant in-place renovation to include new kitchens, new bathrooms, new flooring and fixtures, a fresh coat of paint in and out, and modern upgrades to essential building systems. The renovation commenced in December 2020 and is expected to be completed in June 2023.





Mosaico is a 271-unit new construction flagship property located in the heart of the Allapattah neighborhood of Miami developed in partnership with Integra Investments.

The almost three-year undertaking will be one of the first new construction affordable housing developments for seniors in Miami-Dade County in many years and is expected to be completed in the first quarter of 2022. Lease-up is expected to be completed in the summer of 2022.

Steve Protulis Towers East & West, named in honor of Steve Protulis, President and CEO Emeritus, is a new construction property with two buildings consisting of 119-units located in the Brownsville community of Miami.

The one and two-bedroom units and common area amenities were developed in partnership with Integra and designed to promote 'aging in-place' for seniors. Residents began moving in Quarter Four of 2021 and we expect to successfully achieve 100% occupancy in Quarter One 2022. A grand opening event occurred on December 6, 2021 to dedicate the property with Mr. Protulis' family and friends in attendance.

As we look ahead over new horizons.....

Almost two years of pandemic have passed and the affordable housing crisis has only gotten worse. The U.S. now faces a shortage of 6.8 million rental homes affordable and available to low-income renters whose household incomes are at or below 50 percent of their area's median income. The supply-demand imbalance has only increased in the past two years. The affordable housing units being renovated or added to the affordable inventory are simply outnumbered by the growing need.

EHDOC with its new leadership and committed staff, will continue to look ahead over the horizon and make a huge impact to fill the need.



Albuquerque, NM January 11, 2021:
We are so thankful that our residents and staff have been given this opportunity. We were able to vaccinate the majority of our seniors. Many who did not get a vaccination today have already received one from their doctor.



From SOUTH BOSTON ELDERLY

Boston, MA January 26, 2021:

This Vaccination Clinic took place in the Community Room at South Boston Elderly. The Service Coordinator worked with Walgreens

Pharmacy to come to the building to provide residents the first of two COVID-19 Pfizer vaccinations. Residents were pleased to be vaccinated in the safety of their own building.

From PRETE APARTMENTS

Chicago, IL January 23, 2021:

At Prete Apartments, residents were vaccinated with the first dose of Moderna vaccine with the help of Walgreens Pharmacy technicians. 2020 was a very difficult year for everyone. The advent of the coronavirus meant that senior residents now lived within a smaller world including only their small apartment, TV news about the coronavirus, shopping for groceries in masks, and calls from children and grandchildren because they were not able to visit with them.

How to live with it? All of a sudden - news from the Service Coordinator: "Next week we will have a coronavirus vaccination! Please make an appointment!" We distributed a flyer first and then prepared the sign-up sheet.



From STONINGTON ARMS

Pawcatuck, CT January 16th and February 6, 2021:



Stonington Arms processed over 90 residents, staff and volunteers in collaboration with CVS pharmacy to provide COVID-19

vaccinations. A third COVID-19 vaccination clinic was held at Stonington Arms on February 27th to complete the resident's second dose of the vaccine who were not able to receive their first dose on January 16th.

From TORRE JESUS SANCHEZ ERAZO

Bayamon, Puerto Rico

January 20, February 17 and March 17, November 22 & 24, 2021: COVID-19 Vaccine and Booster Clinics administered by Walgreens and the Municipality of Bayamon were held at our building with the help of our community partners and staff giving our seniors peace of mind and a sense of safety during the COVID pandemic. The staff at Torre Jesus helped our seniors complete applications, print out their documents, and then entered the data in the corresponding agency's system.

Ample space, tables, chairs and plenty of moral support was provided to our seniors. Thanks to everyone's cooperation, after all immunized seniors of our building were counted, it is highly probable that we reached Herd Immunity (the medical term used when a large number of people are immunized during a pandemic).





From COUNCIL TOWERS

Miami Beach, FL January 3 & 4, February 3 & 4, 2021:

In collaboration with the City of Miami Beach, Mount Sinai Medical Center and the Miami Beach Fire Department, Council Towers North and South were the first buildings in the city of Miami Beach to offer the COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic. The vaccine was available to all residents, office staff, maintenance staff and aides providing services to the residents. The two-step vaccine program administered dose #1 on January 3 and 4, 2021 and dose #2 on February 3 and 4, 2021. On both occasions Council Towers staff, Fire Department staff and the City of Miami Beach representatives went to residents' apartments to complete the required paperwork. The Clinic was held in the second floor Community Room. For those residents who had difficulty coming to the Community Room location, the Rescue Department took the vaccine to their apartments. We had the pleasure of the Mayor of Miami Beach, Dan Gelber, visiting our facility during the Clinic. The residents report feeling a sense of security and are grateful for the opportunity to receive the vaccine in the comfort and safety of their own homes.

music. It has provided an uplifting event during


the depressive times of the pandemic.

Swindled by Senior-Oriented Scams

Seniors are often targeted for phone scams, mail scams and internet scams. When someone you don't know calls to tell you that you owe money, never agree to payment until you discuss it with a trusted friend or family member.

Things to consider:

- Use Caller I.D. Don't answer the phone unless you recognize the I.D.
- Hang up if there is a long pause after you answer, which means that the caller is a telemarketer.
- Telemarketers that encourage you to pay money for something immediately while on the phone are just trying to scare you. Hang up.
- Beware of fake charities. Do your giving directly rather than from a phone call or mailer you did not ask for.
- The IRS and other governmental agencies will never call you needing information. Do not believe callers or voice recordings who state they are from these agencies.
- Never give out personal info such as name, social security number, driver's license number, credit card number or your address.
- Ask (or press a button when you can) to be put on the Do Not Call list.
- If you are not interested or feel that something is fishy, just hang up.
- You can always ask your Service Coordinator for assistance.
